Before jumping completely into our spring learning, we will spend a week learning the super hero powers of vowels. Students will become super readers and we will celebrate reading all week long!

After April vacation, we will explore several spring related science themes. We will learn about weather, clouds, the water cycle, insects, and plants. Students will learn about life cycles and will have the chance to explore nature.

In math, we will begin exploring numbers and sums beyond ten. We will use base ten blocks to gain a greater understanding of numbers to 100. We will also continue practicing our adding and subtracting skills, counting coins, and telling time to the hour and half hour.

In reading, we will continue focusing on sight words. Be on the look out for practice sight word fluency in binders. We will also work in our groups to continue blending cvc words, learn beginning blends and digraphs, and learn long vowel (silent e and vowel teams) words. We will also learn about characters, settings, and retelling stories.

In writing, we will continue practicing correct case, spacing, and punctuation.
